

**SCEITEA Division Meeting**  
**Minutes from Wednesday, June 27, 2007**  
**2007 Education & Business Summit – Palmetto Convention Center**

**Members present:**

Andy Dunn, President, Terry Murphy, Past-president, and President Elect, Dwight McDuffie were the officers in attendance. There were 25 additional members at the meeting.

**Old Business:**

Copies of the minutes from last year's meeting were distributed. Minutes were read and approved. Copies of the Treasurer's report were also distributed and approved by the members present.

**New Business:**

A recommendation was made that SCEITEA Officers would serve 2-year terms in each office as opposed to 1-year terms. A motion was made and seconded. The motion was approved by the members present. Revised copies of the Bylaws were presented and approved by the members present.

Keynote speaker Mr. Dave Branter spoke on how to improve achievement in low performing student. Many of his techniques on motivation and expectations were very useful.

Members took a 1 hour break for lunch and then returned for the afternoon activities.

The President Elect for the ACTE national organization also spoke briefly and encouraged members to join the national organization also.

Mr. Jim Spencer gave a brief presentation on changes in Skills-USA and how competitions would now be held all at one time in a central location, similar to how the nationals are done. Additional information would be forthcoming.

Mr. Andy Dunn presented information on OSHA certification.

Mr. Terry Murphy made a presentation on the American Design & Drafting Association and what curriculum certification could mean to drafting instructors across the state.

Roundtable discussions were held on the various topics by the presenters to allow members to get more information and to ask questions.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:20 so members could attend the state SCACTE meeting at 4:30.
